### Facts and Figures #1



Only 29% of the district area amount to ,Urbanized Areas' – **natural areas are within walking distance of people's homes** 




#### The district is already very 'green'

 New urban developments promote ,Living close to and with nature'-lifestyle

#### Low Density

14 pers./ ha vs. 50 pers./ ha in Hamburg  $\rightarrow$  high ownership rate of single family houses **Higher car ownership** per hh. than in other districts in Hamburg





#### Facts and Figures #3



Higher rate of under-18 y/o; High rate of elderly ppl.  $\rightarrow$ those who can move away Nearly 50% of inhabitants with **foreign background**/ **Higher youth unemployment** 


#### Small grained segregation

c. **53 pers**./ ha within 400 m walking radius in rented public housing area vs. c. **25 pers**./ ha in owned single family housing area in the adjacent 400 m walking radius  $\rightarrow$  1000 pers. **more** in public housing area

#### **Co-Planting as a Form of Co-Creation**



- Easy and low cost implementation
- Not restricted to specific target group
- No specific NBS knowledge required
- Changing the perception of where/ what urban nature and biodiversity can be and encourages to find spots themselves to plant; instant identification with living environment





## **Co-Creating a Temporary Garden with and for Refugees**



- Info-Workshop incl. Guided Walk through adjacent nature reserves
- Drawing workshops with children about what they miss in their local environment
- Brochure translated into 7 languages about the local flora and fauna and effects of climate change





## **Co-Creating a Temporary Garden with and for Refugees**




- Co-implementation of raised garden beds and demountable shaded platforms (to be deconstructed when the area is developed into housing)
- Co-implementation of painting the shipping container used as a garden shed





## **Co-Creating a Temporary Garden with and for Refugees**



- Monitoring with questionaires conducted in person as part of an event (games for children, coffee & cake, seating provided)
- Supported by translators for Farsi and Kurdish
- Co-financed by local refugee integration council






# **Co-Creating a Local Community Arts Club** Nat dee Gymnasium Süderelbe / Tanja Jaffal

- One of the teachers of a local secondary school is very active in the local community and wants to contribute to the CLEVER project
- She and her students come up with their own designs for insect hotels during Art Class





#### **Co-Creating a Local Community Arts Club**




- She gathers other locals crafts people who want to build these NBS and put them up in public space
- CLEVER supports them with the foundation of a Local Community Arts Club, helping with cost estimate/ funding, organisational structures and finding a showroom/ workspace, and facilitation with municipality to put them in certain sites





#### **Co-Creating a Local Community Arts Club**









- Online Participation as well as on-site workshops testing new forms of engagement (socially distanced/ COVID-safe cycling tour of the project site)
- Participants were encouraged to suggest additional or potential NBS spots in the project area which are not yet part of CLEVER Cities







• Draft concept of the wayfinding system: aim is also to encourage a spirit of play and exploration and to actively engage with the urban environment through physical activity (fosters health and wellbeing as well as place attachment)



#### Lessons Learnt: What went well...

- Locally tailored Urban Innovation Partner concept in Hamburg
   Each project has its own stakeholder/ participating group; thus they are more invested in the specific project
- **Developing new ways of engagement**, e.g. cycling workshop/ walking tour, active participation not just in the ideation phase, active co-designing of NBS, etc.
- Rethinking the design and 'build' process of NBS

Not just technical experts with a ,planning background', but locally operating general public and special interest groups can co-develop NBS design solutions, too.





#### **Lessons Learnt: Challenges**

#### Non-cooperative stakeholders

e.g. in municipality due to prevailing Silo-thinking system; people tend to participate once, but are hesitant to commit over longer time periods

#### Complex stakeholder structures

e.g. the headmaster of the school is not responsible for contracting out an aquaponics system, but the parents can; but it has to be operated by the school and the central School facility provider has to consent to it being put in the school

Co-creation requires time and increased coordination efforts

 e.g. in Hamburg project implementations started after a c. 2 year ideation and
 design-process





## **Other Challenges**

Locals laws and regulations

e.g. not allowed to pick fruit from public fruit trees, but people wish for edible plants in their neighborhoods

• Design quality vs. Socio-ecological benefits

e.g. co-created NBS do not always lead to better design outcomes because they are often self-build and simple to be accessible to more people

Assessing and Promoting NBS benefits

e.g. growing systems need time to establish themselves, are especially influenced by the seasons, so the monitoring period may be too short to assess the ecological benefits; a lot of interventions are pilot projects and the scale too small to assess their impact
